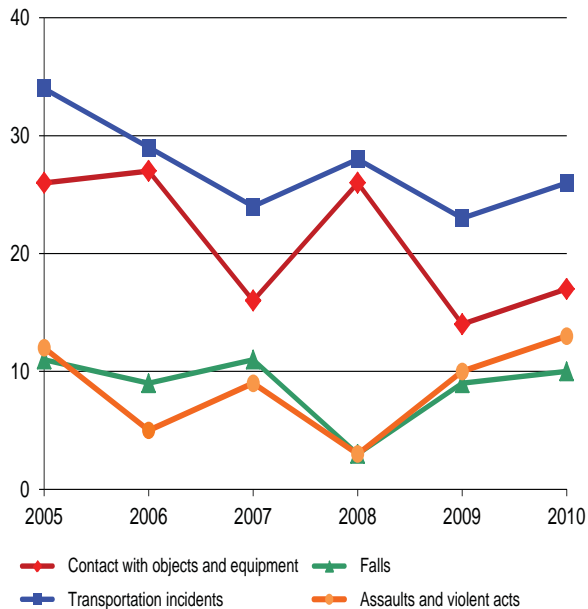


Fatal occupational injuries in 2010

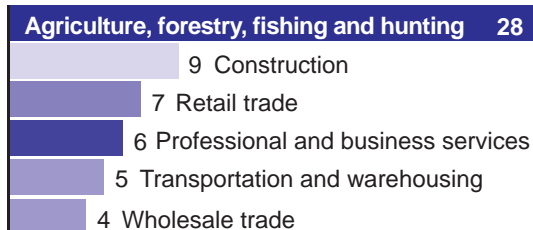
Information about fatal occupational injuries is collected through the *Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries*. Fatalities caused by illnesses are excluded.

- Number of fatal work injuries70
- Average number from 2006-201069
- Fatalities to men64
- Fatalities caused by transportation incidents.....26
- Fatalities to self-employed workers24
(19 of these were in agriculture)

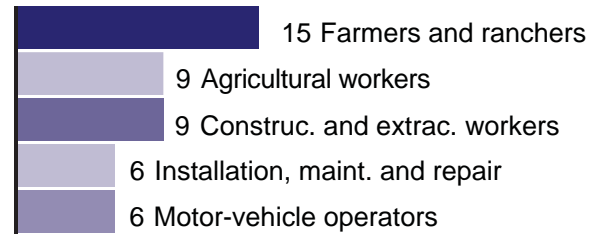
Fatal injury events

Fatally injured Minnesota workers, occupation

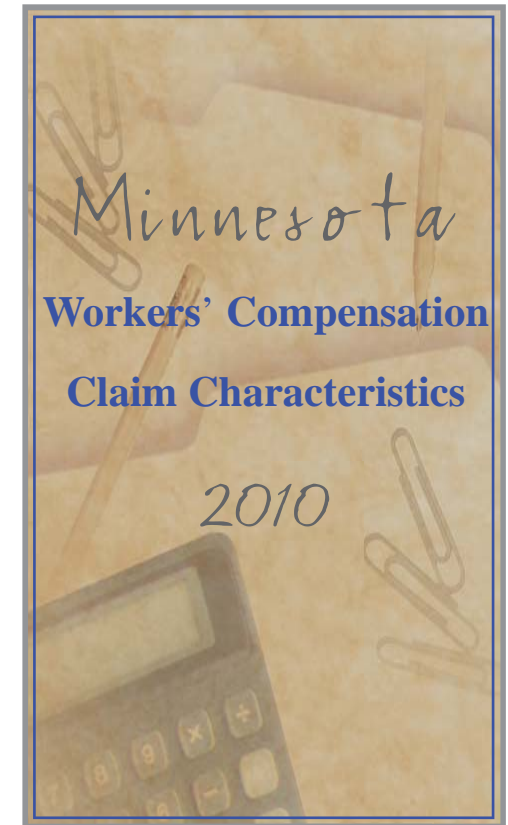


Minnesota employers, employees and safety managers can view useful information about occupational injuries and illnesses at www.dli.mn.gov/Research.asp. Also available online or by request:

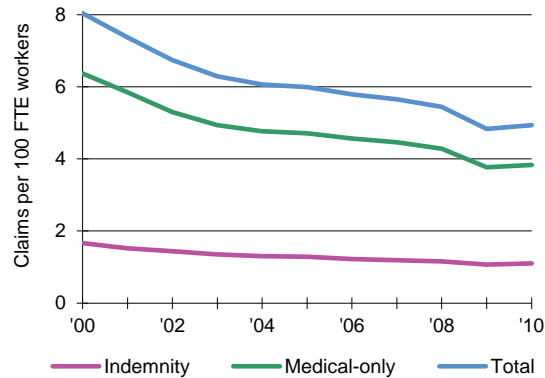

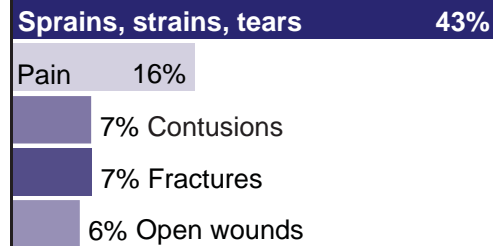

Paid claims per 100 full-time-equivalent workers, injury years 2000-2010

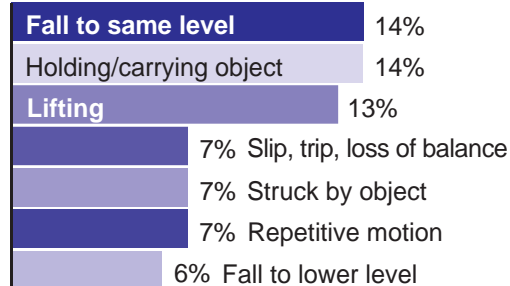


Claim Characteristics

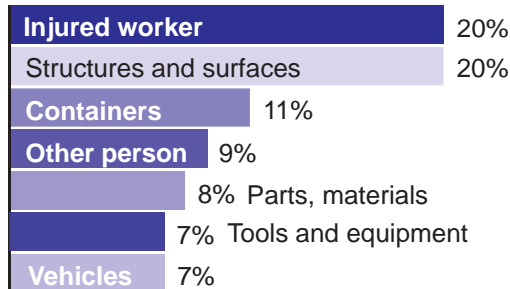
Nature of injury or disease



Event or exposure



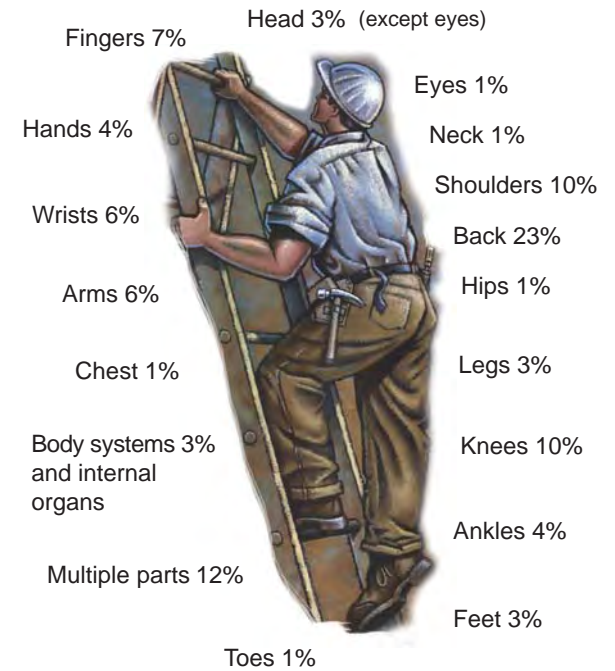
Source of injury



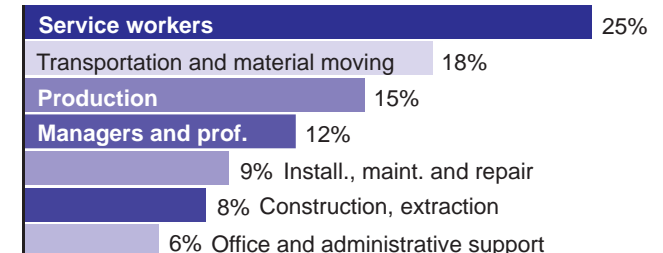
Injured worker characteristics

- 61 percent were men.
- 49 percent were older than 44 years.
- 9 percent were younger than 25 years.
- 22 percent were at their job for less than a year.

Number of claims in 2010

- Number of all claims in 2010: 98,000
- Claims with medical, no cash benefits: 76,100
- Claims with cash benefits: 21,900
- Number of claims with cash benefits declined by 19 percent since 2005.
