## IMPORTANT NOTICE/PURCHASER DISCLOSURE

Regulations of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) CFR3288.5 require that the purchaser of a new manufactured home containing a construction label issued on or after February 8, 2008, shall be provided a copy of the Notice of Dispute Resolution at the time of signing the purchase agreement.

## NOTICE OF DISPUTE RESOLUTION

"The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Manufactured Home Dispute Resolution Program is available to resolve disputes among manufacturers, retailers, or installers concerning defects in manufactured homes. Many states also have a consumer assistance or dispute resolution program. For additional information about these programs, see sections titled "Dispute Resolution Process" and "Additional Information-HUD Manufactured Home Dispute Resolution Program" in the Consumer Manual required to be provided to the purchaser. These programs are not warranty programs and do not replace the manufacturer's, or any other person's, warranty program."

## **NEW MANUFACTURED HOME BUYERS**

HUD Regulations and the State of Minnesota's manufactured home program administered by the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry offer purchasers of new manufactured homes consumer complaint investigations and dispute resolution on certain defects reported to the State Agency within the first year following the initial installation of a new manufactured home.

## **ALL MANUFACTURED HOME BUYERS**

All manufactured homes (new and used) shall be installed by a licensed manufactured home installer in compliance with applicable State and/or Federal requirements for the installation and anchoring of such homes. Minnesota law permits the installation of a manufactured home to be completed by the legal owner of the home provided that the installation complies with all of the requirements under State and Federal Regulations and that all necessary building permits are secured prior to commencing the work. There may be additional costs incurred by the home buyer in complying with building permit requirements and inspections that should be researched by contacting either the local or state authority having jurisdiction.
