IT'S THE LAW.

All employers are required to purchase workers' compensation insurance or become self-insured, according to Minnesota Workers' Compensation Law.

Employers are those who hire others to perform services. Employees are hired to perform services for another. BUT there are exceptions – and some employers are exempt.

This important, employer-focused seminar will identify common misperceptions about workers' compensation insurance, including who needs coverage.
