Adopted Exempt Permanent Rules Relating to Workers' Compensation; Independent Medical Examination Fees in Minnesota Rules, Chapter 5219; Workers' Compensation Medical Services and Fees in Minnesota Rules, Chapter 5221	
Subject matter	<p>The proposed good cause amendments under Minnesota Statutes § 14.388 consist of updates to the rules to implement the independent medical examination fee schedule in Minnesota Rules, Chapter 5219 and the relative value and pharmacy fee schedules in Minnesota Rules, Chapter 5221. The amendments reflect:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • statutes in Minnesota Statutes §§ 176.135 and 62J, requiring all Minnesota providers and payers to utilize electronic medical billing and payment; • statutory changes related to billing and payment of workers' compensation medical and hospital bills; and • wording, formatting and renumbering changes recommended by the revisor.

Published notices and comment periods	<p>The Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) will provide notice under Minnesota Statutes, § 14.388, subdivision 2, which requires an agency proposing to amend a rule to give electronic notice of its intent in accordance with section 16E.07, subdivision 3, and notice by United States mail or electronic mail to persons who have registered their names with the agency under section 14.14, subdivision 1a. The notice will be given no later than the date DLI submits the proposed rule to the Office of Administrative Hearings for review of its legality and will include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) the proposed rule, amendment or repeal; (2) an explanation of why the rule meets the requirements of the good cause exemption under subdivision 1; and (3) a statement that interested parties have five business days after the date of the notice to submit comments to the Office of Administrative Hearings.
