I. Call To Order

The meeting was called to order by Chair Maureen Hanson at 8:06 a.m.

II. Approval of Meeting Agenda

Upon hearing no objection to the Agenda, the Chair declared the Agenda approved.

III. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

A motion to accept the previous meeting Minutes was made by Stevens, seconded by Bozicevich. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

IV. Announcements

- A. Next Regularly Scheduled Meeting

V. Regular Business

- A. High Pressure Piping Code
 - On-line registration of unlicensed individuals was discussed. Todd Green said it was possible the cost would have to be determined. The committee felt that this

option should be further investigated. A motion was made by Bozicevich and seconded by Stevens. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Direct supervision was discussed. The last sentence of the proposed verbiage subpart 5 of section 5 was eliminated. The Committee will submit to the Board for approval.

The title of the code was discussed and referred to the Steam committee.

Geisenhoff 's task to develop a definition of "integral process" has been delayed until the June meeting, and has been shifted to the Steam sub-committee.

Subpart 5. The definition of "Repair" was discussed. The Statute reads no license is required for a repair on an existing installation. There is the need to define what constitutes a repair. Wendy Legge stated that if no license is required, how can the Board place rules on unregulated work? After further discussion, the Committee decided to defer this topic until the next meeting, when the entire Sub-Committee will be present. Committee members were encouraged to develop their own draft proposals.

Subpart 6. Construction was discussed and the language was approved. Stevens moved to accept, seconded by Bozicevich. The vote was unanimous and the motion passed.

Subpart 7. Remedies for licensing violations. The Committee discussed if there should there be an alternative to removal of work installed in violation, or should this section be included as written? A motion to include as written by Bozicevich, seconded by Stevens. The vote was unanimous and the motion passed.

VI. Adjournment

A motion was made by Stevens, seconded by Hanson to adjourn. All voted in favor and the motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 9:50 a.m.
