

Packinghouse Workers Bill of Rights explanation form

Meatpacking and poultry processing employers are required to provide the information in this form to each employee at the start of their employment in the native language of the employee.

The information must be provided in writing and must also be explained verbally to each employee at the start of their employment. More information about these requirements can be found at Minnesota Statutes 179.86 and dli.mn.gov/packinghouse.

Your rights as a meatpacking or poultry processing worker

- You have the right to organize and bargain collectively. You also have the right to refrain from organizing and bargaining collectively. For more information, contact the National Labor Relations Board at 612-348-1757.

- You have the right to be free from discrimination at work based on race, color, creed, religion, national
 origin, sex, marital status, disability, public assistance status, age, sexual orientation, gender identity,
