

"Minor remodel" plumbing plan review checklist

This checklist provides guidance to determine if a proposed project may be considered "minor remodel" in areas where the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) performs plumbing plan review. Minor remodel must meet all the following criteria:

- Seven or fewer standard plumbing fixtures,
- In non-licensed facilities, and
- Must have prior approval by the administrative authority.

Instructions

- If you answer "yes" to any of the questions below, your proposed work does not qualify. STOP and submit complete plumbing plans to DLI for review and approval prior to installation.
- To qualify for minor remodel, ALL boxes in Part A and Part B must be checked "no."

Part A. Facility licensure

Yes \square No \square 1. Is the proposed work in a state-licensed healthcare facility or state correctional facility?
Yes \square No \square 2. Is the proposed work in a commercial kitchen, licensed food establishment, food and/or beverage service facility or food preparation area, or in agricultural licensed food processing/manufacturing facility, or similar licensure?
Examples of licensed food establishments: convenience stores/gas stations, fast food and commercial restaurants, continental breakfast areas, bars, coffee shops, bed and breakfast, cafeterias, wineries, breweries, grocery stores, delis, etc.
Part B. Scope of minor remodel
Yes \square No \square 3. Scope of work is MORE than Seven plumbing fixtures?
Yes \square No \square 4. Consist of new water and/or sewer services?
Yes \square No \square 5. Has the plumbing been installed or completed?
Yes \square No \square 6. Is the proposed work for a new building?
Yes \square No \square 7. Includes new water softener or a water treatment installation?
Yes \square No \square 8. Includes a new water heater with a storage capacity greater than 10 gallons or a potable water heat exchanger? If the project includes a replacement of a like-for-like water heater in the same location as the

original, then mark "No." (Plans must be submitted for water heaters that are increased in size, adding extra capacity or switching from tank-type to tankless water heaters).
Yes \square No \square 9. Includes a flammable, grease, or any other interceptor?
Yes \square No \square 10. Include any fixtures connecting to a chemical waste system or acid neutralization tank?
Yes \square No \square 11. Scope includes alternate materials, fixtures or methods?
Yes \square No \square 12. Installation or modification of any stormwater piping or roof drains?
Yes \square No \square 13. Installation any equipment that will require a pressure or atmospheric vacuum breaker, or a reduced zone pressure (RPZ) backflow preventer on the water supply line?
Yes \square No \square 14. Includes any outside plumbing such water and sewer service connections?
Yes \square No \square 15. Includes nonconventional venting such as combination waste and vent system?
Yes □ No □ 16. Includes a bathtub, combination shower/tub, whirlpool tub, salon sink, or pedicure spa tub?

If you answer "no" to ALL questions in both A and B, you may contact the proper administrative authority at http://workplace.doli.state.mn.us/jurisdiction for their approval then proceed to fill out the required plumbing
